#### **World Mission Day**

Today the Catholic Church celebrates Mission Sunday 2016. Pope Francis in his Mission Sunday message on this Extraordinary Jubilee year of Mercy "invites us to consider the missio ad gentes as a great, immense work of mercy, both spiritual and material". He further said that "on this World Mission Sunday, all of us are invited to "go out" as missionary disciples, each generously offering their talents, creativity, wisdom and experience in order to bring the message of God's tenderness and compassion to the entire human family. By virtue of the missionary mandate, the Church cares for those who do not know the Gospel, because she wants everyone to be saved and to experience the Lord's love.
